

CTC / Cyclenation Conference 2013

Arrival, orientation and cycle parking:

The conference takes place at the Civic Hall in Leeds, on Millennium Square to the North of the city centre.

There is some cycle parking outside the Portland Gate entrance of the Civic Hall, and plenty more outside the Rose Bowl, the new building just North of the Civic Hall. Most of this parking is under cover.

If you prefer to leave your bicycle securely indoors, or if you arrive with your bike at Leeds rail station on the Saturday morning, you can take advantage of the manned, secure cycle parking at Cyclepoint just by the main rail station entrance. You can park for £1 for the day, and we've negotiated with Cyclepoint that they will open early for delegates so you can leave your bike any time after 9am. Cyclepoint is about 10mins walk from the Civic Hall.

I started trying to write instructions on riding from the railway station to the Civic Hall, but honestly it's easier to walk. Welcome to Leeds!

Friday evening social:

Friday night's evening social will be in the Victoria Hotel and Public House on Great George Street. Food orders are taken until 9pm and we have Bridget's room booked, on the left as you enter the pub. It's very informal, so just arrive at your leisure and order your own food and drinks at the bar.
